## Syllabus

Attendance:. If a student is ill or has an excused absence, every accommodation will be made to help that student make up the work missed. Students have one day for each day they are absent to make up the work they missed when absent. It is the student's responsibility to ask for the work they missed while absent, to complete that work in a timely manner, and submit it for grading. When students are absent, they are expected to get the work they missed from the "Absent folder" and write one paragraph about anything they'd like per day absent to make up missing warm-ups. If an assessment was missed, students are expected to arrange a time with the teacher to complete the test or quiz they missed.

Late Work: Assignments (homework, class work, projects, etc.) need to be turned in on the due date. When a student has an excused absence, work will be considered "on-time" if turned in within the grace period. Grace periods for excused absences are the number of days missed plus one day. For example, if the student missed 2 days, the grace period would be 3 days from the day they return to complete the missed work. For unexcused absences, and assignments that were not turned in on time, late work will be accepted under the following conditions:

It must be submitted within two weeks of the due date (it can't be more than 2 weeks late).

Late work needs to be turned in before or after school to me or brought to the office with my name clearly written across the top for the office staff to place in my box.

Late work must be turned in with a "Late Work Submission Request
" or one paragraph explaining why it
is late and what the student will do next time to avoid late work.
Grading: Grading will be conducted in a two part system to better articulate the students' achievement, by pairing a standards based grading system with a traditional letter grade.

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Grading Scale
